Protecting God's Children Workshops

You will need this to do ANY classroom or lunchroom volunteering.

The first Day of School!

Students in grades K-8 will start on Monday, August 27. it will be a regular day: full day (7:28am-2:50pm), regular school day dress code. Chartwells will be serving lunch that day (\$2.40 again this year for lunches, 50¢ for milk only). (Applications for free and reduced cost lunches will be in the packet of papers available at "Crusader Day.") We will have four full, regular days of school before the Labor Day weekend, and there will be no classes on Friday-Monday, August 31-September 3. Classes will resume on Tuesday, September 4, and East China buses will begin their runs that day.

School Chromebooks

Each student in grades 1-8 will be issued a Chromebook after school starts. The Chromebook insurance fee must have been paid, and the annual Internet and Chromebook use agreements signed, before the computer is released to a student. These forms will be included in the "first day" packets available for pickup at "Crusader meet their new students. Packets of "first day." (The packet will be sent home on the first day of school with the oldest student if not already picked up.)

No More Snow Days!

With all students in grades 1-8 on Chromebooks, "snow days" are a thing check out the book fair and gear up for of the past. Annual Pert Control Advisory Notification for Parents

In keeping with the State of Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451 of 1994 and Regulation 637, Holy Cross School has adopted a plan of action for controlling insects, rodents and other pests in and around our facilities.

The school's plan of action for controlling pests incorporates integrated pest management (IPM). IPM utilizes various means of pest control including. but not limited to, habitat modification and sanitation, mechanical control, biological control and chemical control.

Holy Cross School realizes that the use of chemicals can be harmful to the health and safety of humans and the environment; therefore, we will apply chemicals only as a last resort.

If you wish to be notified before a scheduled pest treatment, please complete the form found elsewhere in this newsletter and return to the school office.

Concussions

In order to keep people aware of the possibility of concussions, the law re- \Rightarrow guires adult coaches to complete a (free) online training course (contact Dr Wag- ⇒ ner for info). If a student is withheld from \Rightarrow athletic activities due to a suspected ⇒ concussion, s/h may not return to school that day. The student may return on a subsequent day ONLY with the written clearance of an MD or DO.




