Financial Aid for 2010-11

...will begin with your PSAS application for the Archdiocese of Detroit tuition grant. You can find the application at www.aodonline.org: choose "Catholic Schools" from the left, then "Tuition Assistance." (Copies are also available in the school office.) This application must be postmarked by April 12, 2010; there is a fee to apply. (You'll also need a copy of your 2009 US 1040 tax return.) DON'T FORGET TO KEEP COPIES OF EVERYTHING!

Even if you don't think you'll receive the award, all Catholic families are urged to apply—all other financial aid opportunities will require that you have applied for the Archdiocesan grant (although you won't necessarily have to have received the grant to qualify for other awards).

Non-Catholic families and families with Kindergartners only: save the grant form (even though those students aren't eligible for the grant)—you may need to complete it (without submitting it to PSAS) in order to apply for any other assistance.

Applications are available for the 2010-11 Fr. Bartone Scholarship award—call the school office.
