To obtain online access to your 3-8th graders' school work:

- go to FACTSMGT.COM and click 'Parent Login" (our "district code" is HC-MI);
- select "FACTS Family Portal" from the drop down and choose "create new family portal account;"
- follow the directions, using the email address at which you received this newsletter (as that's the one in the FACTS system, and identifies you).

Attendance is required for anyone who may interact with minors, the elderly, or the handicapped.
