There is a \$50 discount in the reqistration fee for students completely registered by April 30. To register, all obligations from the current school year must be complete-tuition paid up, service credits complete or scheduled and being completed on time; and paperwork in and registration/Chromebook fees paid by Apr. 30.

## Financial Aid for 2018-19

The first step for anyone wanting to apply for tuition assistance is to submit an application for help through the Archdiocese of Detroit. Application is made at www.online.factsmgt.com/aid.
