#### **Registration for 2018-19**

To register, all obligations from the current school year must be complete-tuition paid up, service credits complete or scheduled and being completed on time; and paperwork in and registration/Chromebook fees paid by Apr. 30.

# FACTS Accounts for 2018-19

Families with FACTS accounts for 2017-18 will NOT need to create new accounts for 2018-19: FACTS will automatically re-enroll you for the same plan you used this year. (You do, of course, need to return your registration paperwork to school!) # Financial Aid for 2018-19

# Technology and Data Drive Learning at Holy Cross Catholic School

# Parents, did you know about our advanced technology?



Students in grades one-through-eight all have a

Chromebook loaded with Google-for-Education apps which they are allowed to bring back and forth to and from school. Students can share their writing using Google Docs, advance in math and science using Google Excell, collaborate with each other or even with students in other places, maybe even abroad using Google Hangouts, create ePortfolios to collect evidence of their mastery learning with Google Sites and so much more. Just with the apps available on each students Chromebook now, students can potentially form a partnership with a classroom in another country.



Students in our kindergarten class have access in school to a set of iPads which can enable them to access many programs for mastering the alphabet, phonetic sounds, spelling, site words, arithmetic and even explore science and geography with age-appropriate links.



Every classroom at Holy Cross Catholic School is

equipped with a Smartboard allowing teachers to access inter-active learning programs, create real-time feedback on assessments and help learners understand graphical presentations of testing data.



With the "fund-a-need" raised this year through our Auction and the Annual Alumni campaign for the Fr. Sadler Fund, we plan to purchse a Google Virtual Reality Kit that is a classroom set of googles with access to over 500 virtual field trips.

Technology empowers students and teachers to PERSONALIZE learning experiences reaching out to a world beyond the borders of Our Lady on the River parish. One of the unique applications of technology this year relates to our religion units. Students set up an ePortfolio in Google Sites to collect evidence to prove that they are LIVING THE GOSPEL VALUES.

Parents, did you know about our use of data to drive individualized learning?



My Data Manager Every year in early October, all students in the Archdiocese of Detroit take the Iowa assessments for English, Reading, Mathemathics, Science and Social Studies. These nationally-normed assessments provide scores for each student along with the comparison score for all of the students at our school, all of the students in our region, and all of the students nationally. Students have a report that lets them and their parents know exactly what proficiencies they have mastered and what they still need to master and where they are in comparison with other learners in the diocese, state, and nation. At Holy Cross, our teachers also give the DRA and Gates MacGinitie assements to provide even more data to inform students regarding what each one's unique mastery is and what each one's learning needs are.



Using a software called IXL on the student Chromebooks, students can align their own needs with learning activities that are specific to their own PERSONALIZED data about the mastery of learning.



which is a computer-based reading program with 29 different levels of reading proficiencies from grade one to four. Students in the same classroom could be as widely varied in mastering their reading skills as five or six different levels in a class of nine or ten students. Each one can use his or her Chromebook to access the specific reading level and books written at that reading level to progress in the PERSONALIZED mastery of all twenty-nine reading levels of elementary schooling.

Parents, did you know about the findings in brain research that prove that physical movement enhances brain growth.



Elementary school children love to "be on the move." According to

Marwa Abdelbary's studies on brain-rich learning, " ... studies show that children who are more active exhibit better focus, faster cognitive processing, and more successful memory retention than kids who spend the day sitting still. Keeping the body active **promotes mental clarity** by increasing blood flow to the brain, making activity vital to both learning and physical and neurological health.



At Holy Cross School, our desire is to purchase MP3

players with headphones that allow students to move either walking, running, skipping, or even just pedaling while listening to specifically designed lessons. For example, vocabulary, foreign language, mathematics, memory skills all can be enhanced by moving and listening and saying out loud what one is hearing. For students who want to learn this way, lunch hour recess could involve taking a walk to learning some Spanish vocabulary or jogging the parameter of the gym while learning the multiplication tables. The motion enhances the brains retention of the drills.
