## **Registration for 2018-19**

Registration is open for next year. There is a \$50 discount in the reqistration fee for students completely registered by April 30. To register, all obligations from the current school year must be complete-tuition paid up, service credits complete or scheduled and being completed on time; and paperwork Online application through FACTS is rein and registration/Chromebook fees paid by Apr. 30.

## FACTS Accounts for 2018-19

As it's our first re-enrollment time with FACTS, we've been working to understand the FACTS system to make dealing with it as easy as possible for you.

2017-18 will NOT need to create new accounts for 2018-19: FACTS will automatically re-enroll you for the same plan you used this year. (You do, of course, need to return your registration paperwork to school!) ## **Catholics Personalize Learning:**

## EVERY CHILD CAN LEARN



You are a child of God. You are wonderfully made, dearly loved, and precious in his sight. Before God made you, he knew you. There is no one else like you.

The marque in front of Holy Cross Catholic School has promoted our school for several weeks for the fact that we believe learning should be personalized for each learner. This has prompted many comments both favorably and unfavorably or ambiguity about what it might mean

As a Catholic School our core purpose for even existing is based on the acceptance of the Truth that God create each child in his image and likeness; however, he also created each one as a unique human person. Even identical twins are each unique with his or her own personality, interests, habits, goals and weaknesses. That is the way God made us.

While this does not and cannot contradict the fact of life that our government has legislated mandates for high school graduation, colleges have established pre-requisites for admission, and trade unions have defined very clear prerequisites for entering the trades, this does not mandate that every unique creature must get there at the same time, on the same page, on the same date nor in the same way. God made each person unique in how he or she learns and what is learned and even why it is loved or ignored. Catholic personalize learning because Catholics believe every single child is unique, different, individual and a beautiful creation of God.

While the Archdiocese and the National Council for Catholic Education have established standards and guidelines and assessments to ensure that students in our Catholic school achieve academic excellence which they define in terms of what one shoul d know and be able to do by a given date or grade and level of proficiency. Catholics personalize these learning experiences, however, based on the UNIQUENESS for each child that was intentionally created by Almighty God. This means that learning needs to be "personalized" to the interests, modalities, differentiated skills sets, goals and values unique to each of God's creations.

In our public school system over the last hundred and fifty years in Western Culture, schools leaders and legislatures and colleges and even trade organizations have moved more and more to try to define a set of standards which is a positive thing; however, too often these standards have been mandated under such uniformity and consistency and focus on absolute compliance by a certain time and with a rubrc for identical assessment of results treating everyone as if each is the same as the others.

Of course the real world does exist with these mandates for compliance for Catholic children as much as for public school children. This is the very reason why schools of any domain use identical standards to assess COMPLIANCE. America is proud of our "Schools of Compliance."

In "Schools of Learning" by contrast, God's design in creating each human person as a unique, individual identical to no other person in the very soul that God endowed each with there is a priority on PERSONALIZING the learning experiences reflective of God's plan for his unique creations. Each one develops very different interests, tastes, values, prerferences, modalities, learning styles, and passions.

The more teachers and parents can collaborate with each unique learner to develop a PERSONALIZED LEARNING PLAN to foster the full potential and design that God has gifted each child with as one of His creations, the more likely it will be that each one will become successful and develop a self-motivated, self-enforced, self-monitored, self-assessed passion for learning what and when and how and why he or she most naturally is created by God to strive for. Learning in our Catholic Personalized Learning Schools like we want to make out of Holy Cross Catholic School is our challenge in our drive to UNLEASH THE GOSPEL by feeding the JOY of our learners as youngsters on a mission for their Creator to move forward toward a joyful life and an eternal paradise with God.
