Based on their applications (answering the guestion "What Can I Do to be a Joyful Disciple of Christ?"), the following students have been selected as scholarship winners: 7th grader Allison Kuzera, 6th grader Ava DeVeny, 3rd grader Dominic DeVeny and 1st grader Preston Davenport.

Preston says when other people see him doing good things, "they want to do those things. That shares Jesus' love." Dominic remembers a time he helped a fellow soccer player get up after he fell: "I think he saw Christ in me by the way I treated him." Ava talks about her challenges with three younger siblings, and prays for God's help in controlling anger when they "...push (my) buttons." Allison's essay focused on helping others and being kind, encouraging people to slow down ask themselves: "is this the right thing to do or say?"

Iowa Tests

Students throughout the Archdiocese of Detroit's schools will be taking the lowa tests of Basic Skills in early October. Results of these tests help us gauge each individual child's progress, as well as our curriculum.

All students in grades 1-8 will be tak-Students in even numbered grades also take cognitive abilities tests. The testing is spread out over three weeks; students will have only one test on each testing day.

Classes will take practice tests next, so that everyone knows how to "bubble" answers and becomes more comfortable with the idea of testing.
