Vision and Hearing Screenings

On Tuesday, November 13, technicians from St Clair County Health Department will be here for vision and hearing screenings. Students in grades K, 2 and 4 will have their hearing checked, and students in grades K, 1, 3, 5 and 7 will be able to having vision tests.

If you would like to have a screening done for your child but s/he is not in the grades to be tested, please contact the school office and we'll get appointments with the techs. If you do NOT want your child to be tested as scheduled, please let us know that as well.

Students who wear glasses or contact lenses need to wear them for the vision tests: please be sure to bring them that day.

The Health Department wants you to know that their hearing screenings are performed with audiometers with headphones that have magnets with fairly large field gradients. The headphones were tested in a professional medical laboratory by Codman, a Johnson and Johnson Company. The results of these tests indicate that children with implanted programmable shunts may be at risk for unwanted pressure regulation changes because of the magnet strength. Hearing screenings will not be provided to children known to have shunts or other medical devices with magnets. In order to best protect the children, it is imperative that the technicians are made aware of which children this may include. The Health Department may have alternative hearing screening equipment that does not pose a health risk to those children. Attention Holy Cross Middle School Parents and Students and Community:


We are blessed at Holy Cross Catholic School to have the support of Mrs. Ann Guldemond, who has volunteered to lead our Holy Cross First Robotics Team for "re-formation." Ms. Pam Dezsi had filled this role for us in the past and we are grateful to her for all she did. One of her initiatives was to begin a friendship with the Algonac First Robotics people to help them form their team. Now Mrs. Guldemond has been able to receive support from the Algonac team to help rekindle the enthusiasm for Robotics here at Holy Cross that Mrs. Dezsi started.

We need YOUR help to move forward:

#1 Can you influence your sixth or seventh or eighth grade youngster to seriously considering joining the First Robotics Team at Holy Cross Catholic School. We will need six-to-eight, middle school students who are willing to participate along with our Algonac partners in the construction of our robot and the programming of the bot and also engaging in the collaboration needed to soar ahead in competition.

#2 We will **need some parents** who have or will complete the "Protecting God's Children" training and will help with inventory, setting up our Robotics room in the basement of the Fine Arts Building, transporting team members to the Algonac meetings and the competitions and helping our team learn how to build the robot and program it according to specifications for competition. Will you become a First Robotics MENTOR for Holy Cross students.

#3 We will need to find **community, corporate or college sponsors** to adopt our team and help us on some of the cost for robot tools and parts and also help with knowledge, skills, and dispositions shared with our team members to enable them to learn from adults who are already out in the trenches of new technology.
