Ms. Pam Dezsi had filled this role for us in the past and we are grateful to her for all she did. One of her initiatives was to begin a friendship with the Algonac First Robotics people to help them form their team. Now Mrs. Guldemond has been able to receive support from the Algonac team to help rekindle the enthusiasm for Robotics here at Holy Cross that Ms. Dezsi started.

We need YOUR help to move forward:

#1 Can you influence your sixth or seventh or eighth grade youngster to seriously considering joining the First Robotics Team at Holy Cross Catholic School. We will need six-to-eight, middle school students who are willing to participate along with our Algonac partners in the construction of our robot and the programming of the bot and also engaging in the collaboration needed to soar ahead in competition.
