Attention Holy Cross Middle School Parents and Students and Community:



Now Mrs. Guldemond has been able to receive support from the Algonac team to help rekindle the enthusiasm for Robotics here at Holy Cross that Ms. Dezsi started.

We need YOUR help to move forward:

#1 Can you influence your sixth or seventh or eighth grade youngster to seriously considering joining the First Robotics Team at Holy Cross Catholic School. We will need six-to-eight, middle school students who are willing to participate along with our Algonac partners in the construction of our robot and the programming of the bot and also engaging in the collaboration needed to soar ahead in competition.
