Help with "Carnival Day" **Staff Lunch**


Thank you to Ms. Trish Babel who will be coordinating this lunch with Cardinal Mooney's rep! They will be feeding the teachers from all the participating schools--about 70 people. They plan to have a soup, sandwich and salad bar set up in the CMC faculty area. CMC parents are covering the soup, sandwiches, beverages, half of the desserts and all paper products. HC is being asked to cover the items for a buffet salad bar: lettuce, tomatoes, cucumbers, onions, green peppers, black olives, cheese (cheddar and feta), crumbled bacon, chunked ham and turkey, boiled eggs, croutons, sunflower seeds and dried cherries, as well as a pasta salad, two other salads (e.g. potato, mac, coleslaw), cottage cheese, canned chopped peaches, canned chunk pineapples, two dozen cupcakes, two dozen brownies, and two dozen cookies.
