The Cardinals charged out to a 10-0 lead before the Crusaders slowly clawed their way back into contention. Conor Guyor closed the firsthalf scoring with a buzzer-beating threepointer to narrow the deficit to 18-15. The Crusaders' full-court pressure defense made the difference in the second half with Bryce Schocker, Matt Zammit, and Jimmy Downey making key steals to ignite and complete the comeback. Kyle Miotke capped his recordsetting Crusaders' career by leading all scorers with 21 points. Devin Allam (4), Guyor, Downey, Schocker, and David Marshall completed the scoring in a well-balanced attack.
