A Note on Chromebook Use

Students have been asking if they can use their Chromebooks as a "Guest" user when they complete school work here at school and at home. We discussed as a whole group this morning about why the answer to that is "no." The user agreement signed by students and families at the beginning of each school year is to protect both the children and the technology we have purchased. Our network company blocks many websites to protect our students and to protect our devices and system. By using "Guest" students can bypass the protections we have in place. We are working on a solution to this. If any student is caught using "Guest" on his/her Chromebook, the resulting consequence is loss of Chromebook privileges for a period of time relevant to the infraction. Work will be required to be completed using paper and pencil. We appreciate your support in keeping our children safe and using the school Chromebooks for the educational purposes intended.
