#### **Holy Cross Teacher of the Year**

The Archdiocese of Detroit asked its schools to each submit a teacher for an Archdiocese-wide "Teacher of the Year" award. After asking all our teachers to nominate someone, Mrs. Davenport reports that Ms Tersigni is representing Holy Cross. Here is what "Ms T"'s nomination letter said:

There are clear and effective routines in place. She has a great rapport with her students. Ms. T is deep rooted in her Catholic faith and she shares that passion with her students. She connects all subject areas back to our Catholic faith.

Ms. T's colleagues describe her as a leader, committed, collaborative, and thorough. She utilizes her dedication and compassion to accomplish the school's mission of fostering a setting to ignite a joyful spirit of Christian discipleship in a personalized learning environment.
