Child and Youth Protection

Suggested Equipment Guide for Camp

Use this list as a guide when packing for camp. Make sure you have clothes to dress warmly and be able to change if you get wet. Also, pack in a SMALL space—NO large or hard-sided suitcases or huge duffel totes. We may have to go up stairs and large pieces are difficult to move (let alone store) in the dorms. We recommend you pack in something watertight—30 gallon "Stee-Sack" bags (with your name taped on thenr) or soft-sided taggage with your name in a prominent place work great. Bedding must be in one bag and clothing and essentials in another. Girls— no makeup needed! WE MUST CONSERVE SPACE as everything has to be packed under the bus. Please label all items clearly with your name.

BEDDING

We profer no sleeping bags. However, if you do bring one, use it as a comforter and bring one fitted sheet.

MISCELLANEOUS

pencils laundry bag sunglasses writing paper reading books hand warmers hand lotion frashlight playing cards magnetic compass crossword or search-a-word books

1 small carry-on allowed to take on bus

disposable camera (cell phones are NOT allowed to be used as cameras)

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED

Candy or food of any kind in the dorms (anything left over from the bus ride is disposed of). The snack bags for the way home will be stored in soaled containers.

LEAVE YOUR CHROMEBOOK HOME!

Knives, weapons, drugs, tohacco, etc. are not allowed.

For bus use only: iPods, iPhone watches, cell phones, DVD players, other devices—these items will be collected as we get off the bus and stored in an air-tight container, and will be returned as we get back on the bus on Thursday.

No use of cameras in dorm areas unless an adult is present and gives approval.
