# HOLY CROSS SCHOOL TUITION CONTRACT <br> Tuition Policy 

TUITION
The budgeted cost of educating a child in the school for this year is over $\$ 7000$. The tuition a family pays covers only about half of that amount; the rest comes from Our Lady on the River parish's support and from school fundraising.

Tuition is rated as "In Vicariate" or "Out of Vicariate." Parishioners at any of the Blue Water Vicariate parishes may request the "In Vicariate" discounted rate by completing the "Active Parishioner Verification" form (which is included in the registration packet) and returning the form to their parish office. If granted, "In Vicariate" eligibility will be subject to yearly review and may be withdrawn if families don't attend weekly mass or don't actively support their parish.

Registration fees are due at the time of registration. The standard tuition payment plan calls for 10 equal monthly payments with one due at the end of each month from June through March. (If you wish to request a different payment plan you must send your written plan to the principal. S/he will review your plan and contact you to let you know if your plan is approved.) You are expected to honor your commitment to Holy Cross as faithfully as you want Holy Cross to honor its commitment to your child.

Physical distancing mandated by COVID pandemic has necessarily limited class sizes. Current families will be offered their spots before they are offered to the public, but must register in a timely manner to be assured their spots are reserved. (All obligations of the prior year must be met before registration for the next year will be finalized.)
